Keeping it Simple

Windy Bank Farm is situated close to the M62 motorway near to Hartshead Moor services in West Yorkshire. It is home to the Hightown herd of pedigree Friesians, one of the few pedigree Friesian herds remaining in Yorkshire. The herd swapped from Holsteins to British Friesians in 2008 starting with pure bred Friesians bought from Peter Henfrey of Hebden and a stock bull from the Catlane Herd, Leicestershire. As the farm name suggests, it is very windy and it was felt that Holsteins didn't do so well because of this. The feeding changed too, as the feeder wagon was replaced with a simpler silage and cake system. However, production is very respectable on this lower input system: the herd milk vield average is 7.500 litres/cow/year, with milk fat at an enviable 4.6% and protein at 3.4%. Somatic cell count is kept low at only 55, 000 cells per ml.

So why Friesian cattle at Windy Bank? British Friesians are the milking cow of choice at Windy Bank Farm due to their all-round performance. Milk is of high quality in terms of both protein and fat: and yields are first-rate. Quality bull calves are produced which regularly achieve good market prices of over £150. Also, the cattle are very hard wearing averaging 8 - 10 lactations and lameness issues are significantly reduced in comparison to the previous Holstein herd at Windy Bank. The British Friesian is suited to easier management; they are effective grazers and well suited to a low input business model.

Cattle at Windy Bank are turned out in April and housed late in October. The land is an arable grade clay loam and is well drained and yard slurry/FYM is applied through a West spreader.

During the grazing season, milking cows are fed JAMESON'S GRASS MATCH 16 in the parlour which helps to maintain both milk yield and quality. Cows graze high quality young grasses that are high in sugar. At housing JAMESON'S SUPALAC 18% protein dairy cake is used. The increase in protein drives milk yield throughout the winter months and high quality silage is fed ad-lib via a 'self-feed' system. All milk cows are bulled with a Pedigree Friesian bull.

Heifers are fed JAMESON'S HEIFER GROWER pencils and achieve target growth rates, allowing bulling at 15 months. They are bulled with a pedigree Aberdeen Angus bull, resulting in market topping beef calves.

The message from this West Yorkshire farm is that Friesian cattle are the future of the British dairy industry due to the high level of longevity, great bull calf market prices and low input costs. The motto at Windy Bank Farm is to 'keep it simple!'

High sugar grass

- can you get too much of a good thing? David Lewis

High sugar grasses have received a lot of publicity in the last 15 years. They give good yields of grass which is high in water soluble carbohydrates and therefore higher in energy and more palatable than standard grasses. This increase in both ME and intake has given very good animal performance. But can you get too much of a good thing?

The increase in sugars is at the expense of fibre and protein in the grass. The hemicellulose, cellulose and lignin fractions are all reduced by the increased carbohydrate. In many situations this is good but we have come across

cases where there has been insufficient fibre for the rumen to work efficiently. This results in acidosis and sick animals that won't perform well. The lower protein level in grazed grass is not necessarily a bad thing as the protein can be in excess and the extra intake more than compensates for the weight of protein consumed. In silages however, the lower protein silages will need supplementing with higher protein levels in the concentrate part of the ration.

At Jamesons, we do use high sugar varieties in our mixes. Aberdart, Abergreen and Aberavon are all included in our catalogue of mixtures. We think they have a good role to play but they need to be balanced with other varieties to give a good mix that works well in all situations.

Stop the losses Kathryn Lawson

Results from a recent Eblex research project examining the main cause of death in beef cattle in Co. Durham found that for suckler cows the biggest cause was clostridial diseases, such as Blackleg, Botulism. These deaths could easily have been avoided by using vaccinations.

The more important clostridial diseases of cattle include black disease, blackleg, malignant oedema, tetanus and botulism. Clostridial spores are widespread in the environment, particularly in soil and organic material. Disease in cattle is triggered by various factors which damage body tissues activating latent spores, followed by very rapid multiplication in the animal's body with toxin production, causing death within hours. The response to antibiotic treatment is very poor. Prevention of clostridial diseases by vaccination is standard practice in sheep and should be seriously considered in cattle as it isn't expensive, but could save their lives.

Getting it right for winter cereals

Jonathan Stansfield

Cereal plants require phosphate and potash to maximise yields. Ideally a Soil Index of 2 for Phosphate and an Index of 2- for Potash should be maintained. At these levels yields are maximized and the plant requires just a maintenance dressing. That is, you just need to apply P and K to replace what has been taken off.

If the soil index is lower than this, then more needs to be applied to raise the index to the correct level. At lower levels, yield is restricted and the plant will not respond efficiently to nitrogen application. If the soil index is 3 or above then there is no need to apply any P or K and savings can be made.

At Jamesons, we have soil samplers to lend out to farmers. We recommend soil testing every 3 or 4 years to check indices – the cost is very quickly recuperated. We can supply P or K as either a straight or in a blend.
